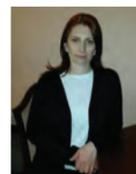


## Staff awards

# Year at a Glance



339 people came to FRANS to get support.



We gave people support for a total of 103,809 hours.



We employed 128 staff:

- 103 Support Workers
- 25 office staff



We had 17 volunteers:

- 11 Directors
- 6 other volunteers



We have been able to offer 34 different programs.  
It cost more than 5 million dollars to run these programs.



To help us run Life Skills Programs, we did some fundraising.  
We made \$211,430 from fundraising.  
This is an increase of 80% from last year.



The money came from:

- grants
- donations
- events



\$125, 976 came from grants.



\$43,945 came from donations.  
We have a special partnership with the 'Townie' –  
Newtown's Town Hall Hotel.

## The support we offer



We give Individual Support to people who need high levels of care.



Our Day Options Program supports adults of all ages on weekdays.  
It is running at 3 locations.



Our Life Skills Programs teach people about things like:

- road safety
- healthy and active life choices
- money skills



They are very popular.



There are 6 people in our Self-Advocacy Group.  
They try to raise awareness of the issues people with disability face.
